

Busy Book Weaving Page
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Before starting, be sure to decide what order you want your pages in. They can be double sided..but you will want to start with the back side page FIRST. Each page has a Left and Right sided version. If you are doing a double sided page, you need to use a R for one side and the L version for the opposite side so they match up correctly.

THIS PAGE CANNOT BE MADE INTO A DOUBLE SIDED PAGE.

Weaving Pieces

(or you can skip these and just use ribbon)

Hoop your stabilizer and run Step 1 the placement line on your stabilizer.



Float felt below and lay a piece on top of the left set of 3 placement stitches.




Run step 2, tack down stitch.




Repeat those steps with the right side set of 2 weaving pieces.

Weaving Page

Hoop your stabilizer and run step 1, placement stitch.



Lay felt over placement line and run step 2, weaving piece placement stitch




Lay weaving pieces or ribbon over placement line, and tape down. (Only let it over hang past the placement stitch about 1/8 -1/4 of an inch)
Run step 3, tack down.



No more then .25 overhang.

Float a piece of felt below your hoop, and fold the pieces back towards you to stitch the slots. Step 4.



Stitch step 5, the final outline/tack down stitch. (This is alittle tricky. You need to move and keep the pieces out of the way.)

Run step 6, the holes for your binder rings or ribbon to tie through. Unhoop, trim and use a crop a dile or hole pund to punch out the holes and your done!
